- Revision to Duty at 7.6
- Additional duty (7.7) in relation to Committee Workplans and review of Internal Audit Plan.
- IGC can also play a role where a subject matter ranges across a number of governance committees, and highlighting where the cumulative from each committee may necessitate review by the Board.
